TRANSPORTATION INVESTMENT STRATEGY

for Washington State PHASE II

Staff from the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), the state's Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and Regional Transportation Planning Organizations (RTPOs) are building a collaborative approach to identify transportation priorities.

This will help the state legislature and other decision makers select which transportation projects to fund and make other budgeting decisions.

The Approach

In *Phase I*, which ran through February 2021, the Investment Strategy Committee identified three key issues to resolve. Then it created subgroups to build a strategy for each. In *Phase II*, the committee is pursuing those strategies.



Strategy A



Tailoring for the Near Term

ISSUE

Regional plans vary in how they differentiate between near-term and long-term projects, or projects of higher priority.

STRATEGY

The Committee looked into identifying a common set of tools to prioritize transportation investments for near-term legislative funding. As a result, the Committee recommended holding an annual WSDOT/MPO/RTPO workshop that focuses on local and regional alignment.

Strategy B

Illuminating the Process

ISSUE

Stakeholders and RTPOs need to better understand how the State develops budgets — particularly how the legislature works with WSDOT — and how to influence the process.

STRATEGY

WSDOT hosted a workshop with RTPOs/MPOs to outline how investment priorities are identified, how budget requests are developed and submitted to the Governor, and how informal requests for new revenue are addressed.

As a result, the Committee recommended developing a biennial budget process calendar, holding regular information updates with RTPOs/MPOs, including sharing the State of Transportation and budget de-briefings, and developing an MPO/RTPO Informational Paper.

Strategy C



Focusing on Recommended Priorities

ISSUE

Statewide needs may not have consistent advocacy due to varying degrees of collaboration on statewide priorities within regional plans, and different methods of legislative engagement.

STRATEGY

The Committee researched national best practices for collaborative prioritization processes. As a result, the Committee recommended holding an annual WSDOT/MPO/RTPO workshop focused on local and regional alignment and to explore opportunities for legislative engagement.
